

Planning

As an engineer, I created plans to communicate how to manufacture parts that I developed. Plans are two-dimensional diagrams used to describe an object and communicate building and/or fabrication instructions. A plan view is a projection looking down on the object, like in a floor plan for a house. When I created the design for this quilt along, I started by overlapping various sizes of rotated plus shapes and the end result strongly reminded me of the plan view of the John C. Hodges library (the library of my college alma mater), resulting in the name of the design.

The Planview quilt requires 6 fabrics: a background fabric (BG) and 5 fabrics for the central design (Fabrics A-E). For my sample lap size quilt, I opted to move around the color wheel for my central fabrics and use a contrasting fabric for the background.

Note that the Planview design lends itself best to small scale, non-directional prints.

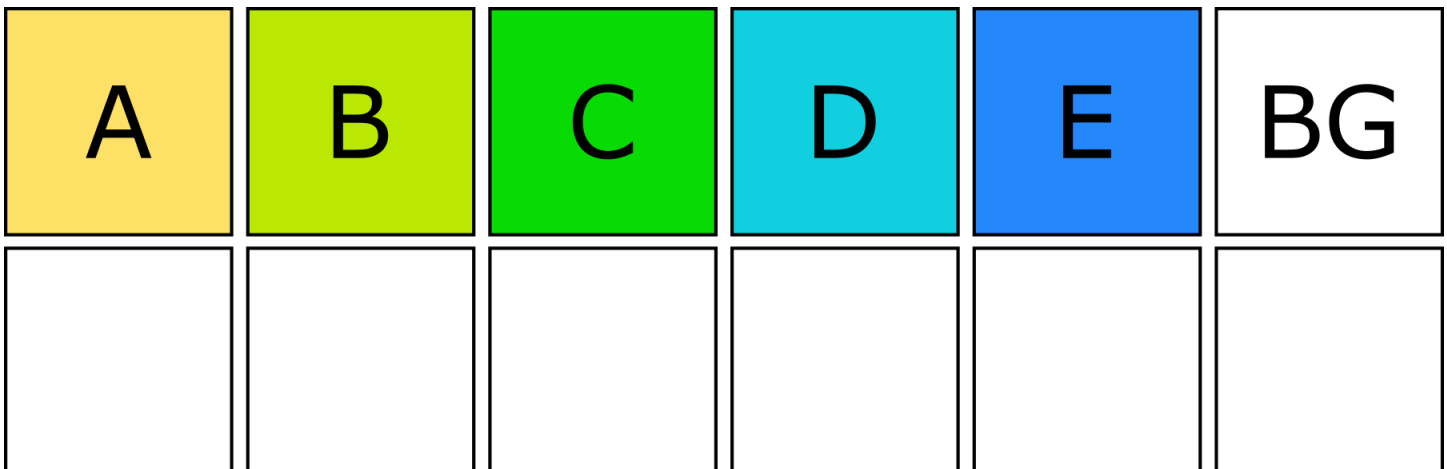
The sample lap quilt was pieced using fabrics provided by Northcott Fabrics.

- Fabric A – Criss Cross SUNNY 10010-5
- Fabric B – Hatching LEAF 10009-71
- Fabric C – Sticks IRISH 10007-72
- Fabric D – Sparkle CARIBBEAN 10003-62
- Fabric E – Boomerangs CORNFLOWER 10002-42
- Background – Open Weave White 10015-10

The quilt along offers 6 sizes to choose from: wall (30" x 36"), baby (40" x 48"), lap (60" x 72"), twin (80" x 96"), queen (90" x 108"), or king (100" x 120"). The fabric requirements, including backing and binding yardage, for each size option are listed on page 4.

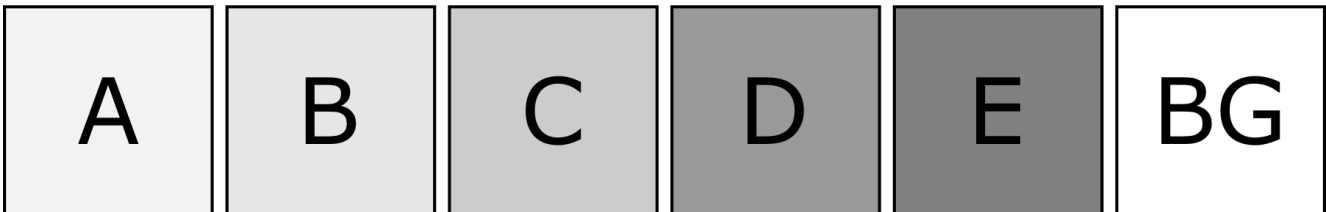
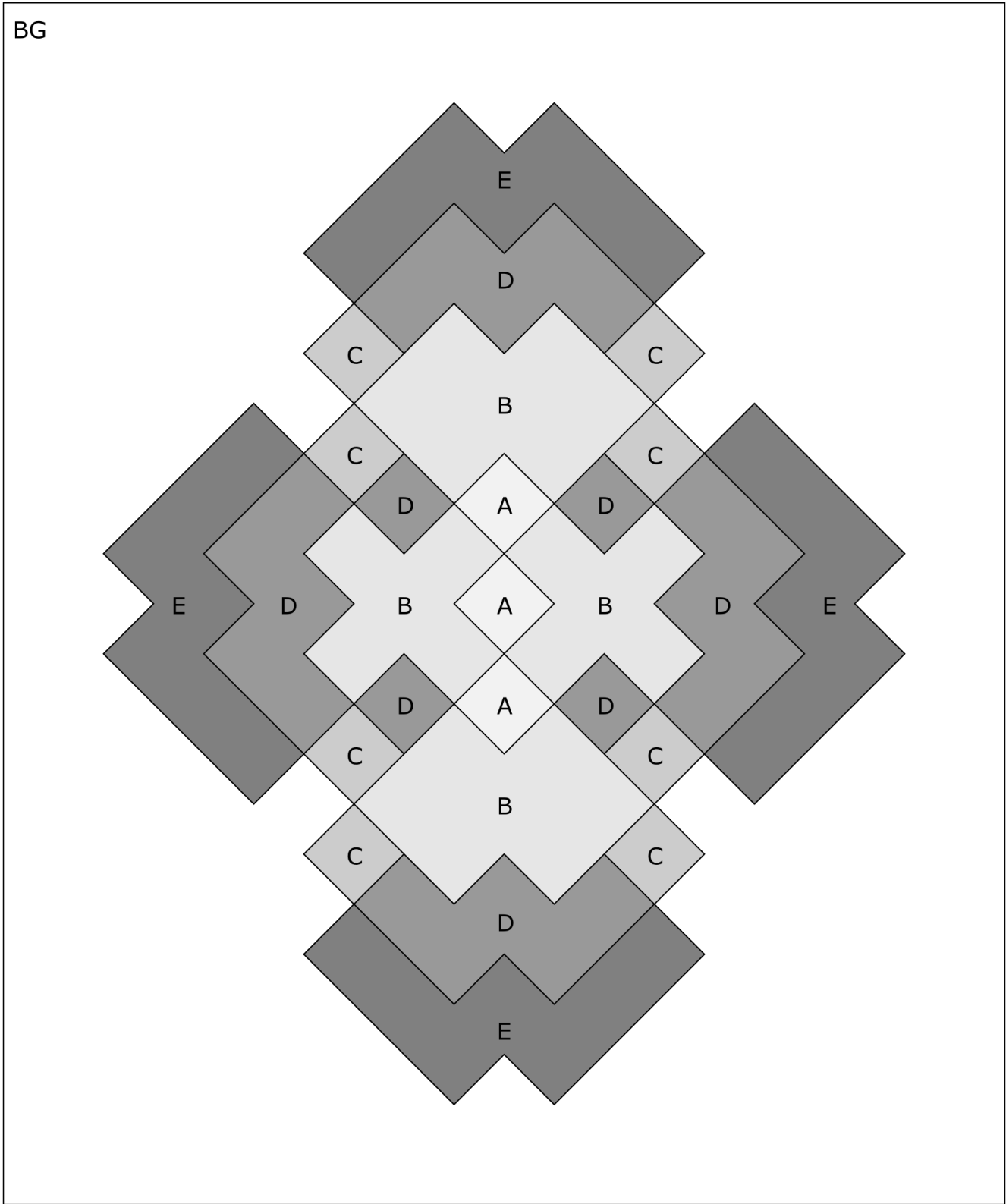
Pages 2 and 3 offer two versions of a coloring page for you to use to explore your own fabric selection ideas. The first coloring page shows the where each fabric will be used and the second coloring page is a blank wireframe to give you more flexibility. I also like to use blank patterns to doodle and design my quilting motifs. The proportions of each quilt size are the same, so the coloring page works for all quilt sizes.

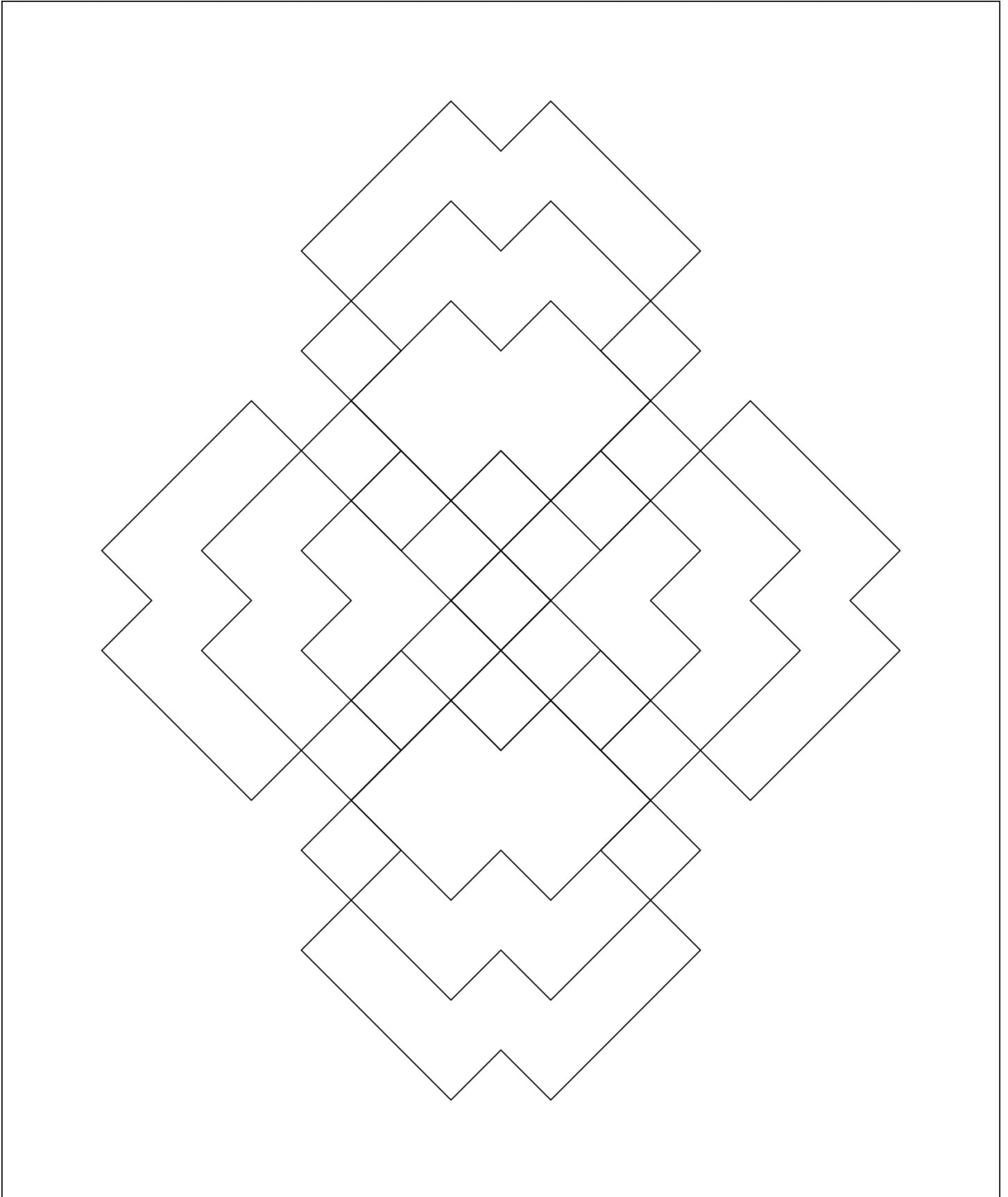

Fabric A – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric B – ⅜ yard
Fabric C – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric D – ⅜ yard
Fabric E – ⅜ yard
Background (BG) – 1 yard
Backing – 1¼ yards
Binding – ⅜ yard

Baby Quilt (40" x 48")

Fabric A – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric B – ⅜ yard
Fabric C – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric D – ⅜ yard
Fabric E – ½ yard
Background (BG) – 1¾ yards
Backing – 2¾ yards
Binding – ½ yard

Lap Quilt (60" x 72")

Fabric A – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric B – ¾ yard
Fabric C – ¼ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric D – ¾ yard
Fabric E – ¾ yard
Background (BG) – 2¾ yards
Backing – 4 yards
Binding – ⅝ yard

Twin Quilt (80" x 96")

Fabric A – ⅜ yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric B – 1¼ yards
Fabric C – ⅜ yard
Fabric D – 1¼ yards
Fabric E – 1¼ yards
Background (BG) – 4¾ yards
Backing – 7½ yards
Binding – ⅞ yard

Queen Quilt (90" x 108")

Fabric A – ⅜ yard
Fabric B – 1⅝ yards
Fabric C – ¾ yard
Fabric D – 1⅝ yards
Fabric E – 1⅝ yards
Background (BG) – 6½ yards
Backing – 8¼ yards
 or Wide Backing – 3¼ yards
Binding – ⅞ yard

King Quilt (100" x 120")

Fabric A – ⅜ yard
Fabric B – 1¾ yards
Fabric C – ¾ yard
Fabric D – 1¾ yards
Fabric E – 1¾ yards
Background (BG) – 7½ yards
Wide Backing – 3¾ yards of
 108" wide backing
Binding – 1 yard
